CSCE CANADIAN NATIONAL CONCRETE CANOE COMPETITION



The first Canadian National Concrete Canoe Competition (CNCCC) took place in 1994 and has been going strong ever since. It is modeled after the annual concrete canoe competition organized by the American Society of Civil Engineers and is held annually in early May. The competition consists of design presentations, races, and social events, and offers the opportunity to students to apply their engineering concepts and theories.

This year's event took place at the University of Waterloo in Waterloo, Ontario. 16 teams from across the country competed in the competition, and although all the teams deserve great applause, there was only one winner.

CSCE-CISC CANADIAN NATIONAL STEEL BRIDGE COMPETITION



TThis year marks the 3rd Canadian National Steel Bridge Competition co-organized by the Canadian Society for Civil Engineers and the Canadian Institute of Steel Construction. It is modeled after the National student steel bridge competition co-organized by the American Institute of Steel Construction and the American Society of Civil Engineers. The teams design a steel bridge by themselves and then build it in a timed competition.

This year's event took place at the University of Waterloo in Waterloo, Ontario. Eight teams from across the country competed.

CSCE NATIONAL CAPSTONE DESIGN COMPETITION

The CSCE National Capstone Design Competition began in 2013 as a way for senior undergraduate students to showcase their final year, or CAPSTONE, project. The CAPSTONE project is the cornerstone of many accredited civil engineering programs in Canada. Each civil engineering program in Canada is invited to submit a nomination for a single entry into the competition in any specialty area. Two students from each nominated team are expected to attend the annual CSCE conference to present their project in a poster session before a panel of seasoned practitioners as judges. The winner and runners-up are announced at the Student Awards Luncheon.
